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kiing is one of Slovenia's favourite sports. It has a long tradition here which began with skiing on the Bloke plateau. The first records of skiing in central and southern Europe were made by Janez Vajkard Valvasor in his work Slava vojvodine Kranjske (1689), in which he describes in detail skiing on Bloke.









ne of our earliest and most important sports skiing centres was Tržič, which is also home to the largest number of Slovenian Olympians who participated in the Winter Olympic Games. It is therefore no coincidence that the Slovenian Skiing Museum is located in Tržič.

What can you see in the Slovenian Skiing Museum?

THE DEVELOPMENT OF SKIING THROUGH TIME

The museum exhibition shows how skiing developed from prehistoric times to the present day, from the times when skis helped people travel over snow-covered territory to sports skiing.

THE DEVELOPMENT OF SKIS AND ACCOMPANYING EQUIPMENT

The exhibition includes numerous skis that were used in different periods from Bloke skis to modern skis and the equipment that goes with them: ski poles, shoes, clothes.

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MAKING SKIS THE OLD WAY

You can see the equipment that was used for the homemade production of skis in wheelwrights' workshops.

SKIING IN TRŽIČ

Part of the collection is dedicated to the beginnings and development of skiing in Tržič with a presentation of champions who came from Tržič: Jože Šlibar, Bojan Križaj, Andrej Jerman and Žan Košir.

SLOVENIAN ALPINE SKIING CHAMPIONS

A special place in the museum is set aside for the Alpine skiers who achieved the greatest successes at the Olympics, World Championships and the World Cup.
